While Wings for Widows was founded in January 2018, our first full year of operation was in 2019. And what a wonderful year it was!

Wings for Widows serves the emotional and financial needs of the newly widowed, at no cost. With over 1 million women becoming widows in the U.S. each year, the need for our services is overwhelming. To the best of our knowledge, there is no other organization like us.

We served 80 widows in 2019, only a fraction of the 10,000 new widows in the Twin Cities. Helping a handful of widows may not change the world, but we may have changed the world for those we helped. We honed our processes, recruited more volunteers and our donations were up 260% over 2018. Thank you to all who helped make an impact by giving or volunteering, or both.

Losing a spouse is one of life's most emotionally - and for many, financially - disruptive events possible. Research shows that 69% of widows believe "becoming the sole financial decision-maker" was the top financial challenge of widowhood. So, who can these widows trust for coaching, education and counseling? Wings for Widows.

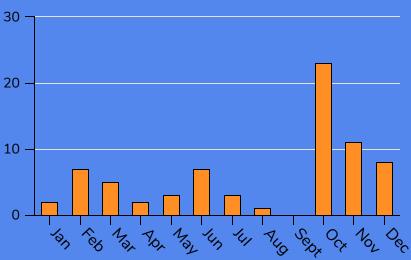

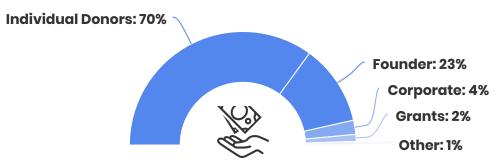
Widows Served by Month, 2019

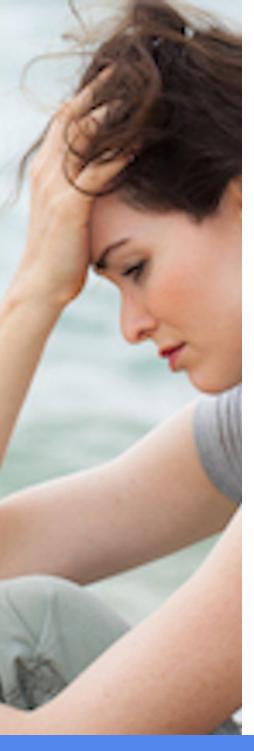

Diversify and Expand Board

We plan to expand our board of directors from 7 to 13 to add diversity, experience and additional oversight.

Upgrade Progress Check Evaluation Tool

Taking our Progress Check is the first step for a new widowclient. Our software is unstable and unreliable; we plan to update the tool to better serve our clients.

Upgrade CRM Software

We plan to upgrade our contact management software using Bloomerang. This upgrade will allow us to better track and manage clients, donors and volunteers.

Convert Accounting to QuickBooks

We plan to upgrade our accounting from Wave to QuickBooks Online. This upgrade will allow us to prepare standardized financials and facilitate completing IRS From 990.

Hire and Develop Full-Time Staff

We plan to hire and develop an executive assistant to begin our efforts of building a permanent staff for Wings for Widows.















BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Our officers and board of directors are from all walks of life, but all have a heart for distressed women in transition. Specifically, widows, who often do not have the experience or knowledge of managing her household finances. All widows have to deal with financial, legal, and other practical matters; and it gets even more complicated with young children. Our officers and directors understand the widow's plight, because many of our volunteers are widows and have walked in the same shoes. We are a strong team united around a powerful mission.
